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AWIS WOOL MARKET REVIEW

Week Ending 23 October 2015 (Week 17)

The AWEX EMI finished 36ϕ higher (+3.1%) in Australian currency and 13ϕ higher (+1.5%) in US currency at sales in Sydney, Melbourne and Fremantle this week.

37,139 bales were on offer nationally, compared with 40,762 bales last sale. 3.0% of the offering was passed in.

The market had its first increase since Week 11, with good rises across all micron ranges and wool types on Wednesday; and even stronger rises on Thursday. Trade reports indicate that there was strong widespread competition.

Merino average MPGs rose by 3 to 4% across all micron ranges, other than at 16.5 microns where the rise was 2.0% There was improved demand for Merino fleece types that was reflected in their lowest pass-in rate for the season (3.4%). Prices for Merino skirtings moved with the fleece types.

Crossbred prices also showed some recovery after three weeks of falls when most average AWEX MPGs rose by 1 to 2%. Oddments also moved up, with the average AWEX Merino Cardings Price Guide up by 1.0%.

The US exchange rate finished 1.15ϕ (-1.6%) lower to close at 72.03ϕ on Thursday. This followed three weeks of rises. Most of the fall occurred on Thursday when the Commonwealth Bank lifted the interest rate on home loans by 0.15%, prompting speculation that the Reserve Bank will ease the official interest rate when it meets on 3 November.

Buyers for China were dominant, with support from buyers for Europe, Korea and India.

Looking ahead, the current expected offerings for the next three weeks are all down on last season (see next page). 2015/16(black graph line) and 2014/15 (red graph line)










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
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
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
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





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
